### Day 1: Monday 14 June



▲ **Monastery of Martyrius, in Ma'ale Adumim**, centre of monastic life in the Judean Desert during

the Byzantine period

▲ **Archeological Park, Ramat Rachel** hosting the remains of a massive palace and waterworks, dating back to the early Israelite kingdom

▲ **Mamilla Project**  
\$400 million commercial and housing district. Free time for supper

▲ **Tower of David**  
Sound and Light Show. The walls of the Citadel are the stage for a night-time celebration of light and sound. The story of Jerusalem unfolds through giant virtual reality images

### Day 2: Tuesday 15 June



▲. Walk through the **Streets of Jerusalem** focusing on the Mandate Period and buildings and monuments from the

1930s

▲ **EITHER: Menachem Begin Museum** experiential, multimedia exhibit telling the story of the State of Israel through the life of Menachem Begin

▲ **OR: Great Synagogue** with its architectural splendor and stained-glass windows and The Jacob Z"L and Dr. Belle Rosenbaum Mezuzah collection

▲ **Lunch on campus**

▲ **The Hebrew University** tour includes the story of its establishment, events during the War of Independence, botanical gardens, synagogue, and the British cemetery

▲ **Dinner at Anna Ticho House** visit to the museum & jazz!

### Day 3: Wednesday 16 June

▲ **City of David** Tour of Biblical Jerusalem going back to the days of David, when the first foundations of the city were laid. The underground journey explores the recently excavated fortresses and passageways, ending at the Gihon Spring, the major water source of Jerusalem for over 1,000 years



▲ **Walking tour of Ein Kerem**, the picturesque valley neighborhood, with its charming houses, arches, churches and stone-paved paths

▲ **Chagal Windows**

Stained glass windows at the synagogue of the Hadassah Hospital, depicting the Twelve Tribes of Israel

▲ **Lunch at Beit Hamaayan**

▲ **Herzl Museum**

An interactive look into the Jewish world according to Herzl's insights: his bold aspirations and disappointments during his stormy personal journey
