In 1993, NYPD officer and caving enthusiast **Chris Nicola** visited Ukraine to explore the **Verteba** and **Priest's Grotto Caves** and found evidence that they had recently been inhabited by humans. Chris spent 10 years in confirming that a rumor he had heard about some Jews surviving the Holocaust by living in a cave was true by finding survivors, and then another 10 years in bringing about both a book and documentary film that then led to the making of ***No Place On Earth***.

Chris is visiting Israel in November and will join us at Netanya AACI for our screening of *No Place on Earth*. The film tells the story of how Chris discovered the cave that was refuge for five

Jewish families for more than 500 days, how he interviewed some of the 36 survivors, and/or their descendants living mainly in New York City and Montreal. The film made in 2012 follows Chris as 67 years later he leads four of the survivors back to Ukraine to say thank you to *the cave*.

Chris will introduce the film, and then lead a discussion and Q&A session after our screening.
